The Presidential Preference Primary Election (PPP) is part of the presidential nominating process for Florida's two major political parties. Voters registered with those parties express their preference for the presidential candidate they would like to see representing their party on the General

Election ballot in November. After the PPP, designated political party delegates from Florida formally nominate the preferred presidential candidate at the respective party's national convention.



There will only be a primary for the Republican party this year. The Florida Democratic Party already chose President Joe Biden for this November's ballot last year.
