Food Costs

The rising costs of food at restaurants and the grocery store is taking a bigger bite out of monthly budgets. Seven dollars for eggs, eight for bacon - costs are pricing Americans out of basic needs. Despite inflation slowing down, food prices continue to increase. The Consumer Price Index shows food purchases, including groceries and restaurants, are getting worse for your wallet. Grocery prices have jumped by 25 percent over the past four years, outpacing overall inflation of 19 percent during the same period. And while prices of appliances, smartphones and a smattering of other goods have declined, groceries got slightly more expensive last year, with particularly sharp jumps for beef, sugar and juice, among other items. As a whole, food prices are expected to rise in 2024, albeit at a much slower pace than they did in 2023, according to the USDA Economic Research Service food price outlook released in January. In fact, grocery prices could actually fall slightly in the coming year, the USDA, predicts, while the cost of dining out will probably rise at a rate similar to 2023's increase.

<u>Do television shows</u> have more commercials now than they did in the 1960s and 1970s?
